OLDEST WINNER EVER RETUNS FOR DEFENSE OF SENIOR OPEN TITLE

The MGA Senior Open heads to Sunningdale Country Club in Scarsdale, N.Y. on August 26-27 and features a field of 111 talented and veteran professionals and amateurs competing for one of the Met Area's top senior titles and a \$25,000 purse.

After winning his first MGA Senior title in 2012, Peter Busch of Galloping Hills returns to the field looking to defend the trophy he won in a hard fought playoff with 2004 champion Ed Whitman of Knickerbocker. Busch, the oldest player to hold the title, is in top

form and qualified for the 2013 U.S. Senior Open, but may could have to fend off another

challenge by Whitman following Whitman's solid performance in the 2013 Met Open at Old Westbury.

Relative newcomers to the senior ranks and sure to be a factor in this year's competition are three-time NJPGA Player of the Year and reigning (2013) New Jersey State Open Champion, Frank Esposito of Brooklake, two time Met Open winner Mark Mielke of Mill River, and 2009 Westchester Open champion Craig Thomas of Metropolis, all at the top of their games and a threat in any field.

Also leading the charge will be two time champion Darrell Kestner of Deepdale (2003, 2005) who, in addition to his two MGA Senior Open titles, has the most top ten finishes in this event. He'll join other past MGA champions including 2007 Senior Open winner Bruce Zabriski of Westchester, the youngest winner (2007), 2008 and 2009 Senior Open Champion Bobby Heins of Old Oaks (2008-2009), Bill Britton of Trump National – Colts Neck (2006), Mike Burke of Montammy (2011) and the Senior Open's only amateur winner, John Ervasti of Sleepy Hollow (2010). The amateur side of the field is exceptionally well represented this year and

threatens to add another winner from their ranks. In addition to Ervasti, look for Allan Small of Fairmount, the 2009 MGA Senior Amateur champion, who will be making his 21st appearance in a USGA championship in September at the U.S. Senior Amateur, John Tingley of Stanton Ridge, the 2013 MGA Senior Amateur champion, Robert Howe of Winged Foot, the inaugural MGA Senior Masters champion (2012); ten-time MGA Player of the Year George Zahringer III of Deepdale, 1997 U.S. Mid-Amateur Champion Ken Bakst of Friar's Head, two time MGA

Meadow, as well as 2012 and 2008 MGA Senior Amateur Champion Ron Vanelli of Forsgate, who was T-6th in this event in 2012.

The MGA Senior Open is contested over two days of stroke play with the field cut after the first round to the low 40 players and ties and anyone within five shots of the lead. It is open to golfers who will have reached their fiftieth birthday by August 12, 2013. Due to a large number of entries for this event, 2013 was the first year that the MGA held a sectional qualifying round to determine the final field.

Sunningdale, a challenging and picturesque Westchester layout, should prove to challenge the field and make for an excellent two days of golf for the 17th editionof the MGA Senior Open.

- 5. Professionals who are bona fide members with full golfing privileges at MGA member clubs, have a residence in the MGA territory and a current USGA Handicap Index not exceeding 4.5 under the Men's USGA Handicap System at that MGA member club
- 6. Amateur members and applicants for Amateur reinstatement at MGA member clubs with a current USGA Handicap Index of 4.5 or less under the Men's USGA Handicap System

About Sunningdale Country Club




The Sunningdale Country Club was established in November of 1913 by a group of twelve men, the majority of them in the clothing business. The club's early roster included such names as Gimbel, Bamberger, Stern, Rothschild, and Wallach.

Sunningdale's founders leased a ready-made nine-hole golf course in Mt. Vernon, near the intersection of White Plains Road and (what is now) the Cross County Parkway. It had been the second home of the Siwanoy Country Club, which moved to its present site in Bronxville for the 1914 season.

But like Siwanoy, Sunningdale soon felt the need for an 18-hole course, and in midsummer of 1916 purchased the present 175-acre site in Scarsdale, high above the Sprain Brook Parkway. The grand opening took place on Memorial Day, 1918.

Sunningdale's first 18-hole golf course proved unsatisfactory, and in 1920, A.W. Tillinghast was commissioned to make a major revision, giving the club a precise driving course with seven doglegs and six severely-tilting fairways.

The course plays over typically-rolling Westchester terrain, and features three especially picturesque par 3's – one over a pond, another across a deep gulley, and the third straight downhill off the face of the earth.



16th MGA Senior Open Championship

Garden City Country Club August 27-29, 2012

For the first time since 2000, the MGA Senior Open was decided in a playoff as veteran New Jersey professionals battled it out at Garden City. Peter Busch of Galloping Hill played his way into the final pairing with a 2-under 68, three strokes behind the competi-

tive course record of 65 shot by Ed Whitman of Knickerbocker. In the final round of the championship, the longtime friends recorded matching scores from the 14th hole on and, following pars on the par-4 18th hole, headed back to the par-4 first hole to battle it out for the trophy. Whitman hit a shot out of a bunker and over the green, but Busch made a routine par to become the oldest winner of the championship at 59 years and two weeks. Al Small of Fairmount was the low amateur with a final score of 2-over 142.

History of the MGA Senior Open

Though it is young as far as MGA championships go, the MGA Senior Open has a

high profile among the top players in the Met Area. The already strong fields who gathered for the championship's early years became even stronger in 2003 with the influx of several very accomplished 50-year-olds, headed by Darrell Kestner of Deepdale, a three-time Met Open champion, who won in his first year of eligibility in 2003 and again in 2005. Other recent champions of note include former PGA Tour winner Bill Britton of Trump National-Colts Neck (2006), two-time Met Open winner Bruce Zabriski (2007), and back-to-back winner Bobby Heins (2008 and 2009). Together with an everincreasing number of top amateur competitors, these players have produced drama and excitement at recent playings of the Senior Open.

The MGA Senior Open has been held at such storied venues as Tuxedo, Century, Metropolis, Fenway, Fresh Meadow, and Nassau. It is the largest event in local senior golf. The 36-hole event is contested at stroke play over two consecutive days, with the field cut after the first round to the low 40 and ties, and anyone within five shots of the lead.
