GOLFWORKS BACK IN ACTION!

After a COVID pause in 2020, the MGA Foundation's signature GOLFWORKS student intern program was back in session for the 2021 season. With nearly 150 participants at 39 member clubs and facilities, interns were back at work in pro shops, bag rooms, on the grounds crew, and in the kitchen and clubhouses throughout the Met Area. Notably, 18 former GOLFWORKS interns were hired directly by clubs, proving the program's success for both the interns and our participating clubs.

147 GOLFWORKS interns were placed to work at 39 clubs and facilities this season.

More than 250 new caddies were certified by the MGA Foundation through 10 virtual Caddie Academies in the spring.

299 Westchester Golf Association and Long Island Caddie Scholars were awarded \$1,184,000 for the 2021-2022 academic year.

These scholars attend 157 colleges and universities and work in service to golf at 93 Met Area clubs.

\$45,700 was raised from the "Fore the Kids" virtual auction in the spring, which directly supported all MGAF initiatives and programs.



Since 2018, the MGA Foundation has partnered with the national **Youth on Course** program to provide discounted rounds and increased golf access for junior golfers. This season, nearly **2,500** rounds were played by local YOC members. Participating golfers ages 6-18 can enjoy \$5 rounds at more than **30 courses and facilities** across the Met Area.

Matthew DiFiore has been a Youth on Course member since 2018. He learned about YOC through the staff at Bethpage, and Matthew has taken full advantage of the discounted access to all five participating Bethpage courses.



JAY MOTTOLA SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

The inaugural Jay Mottola Scholarship was awarded to Sam Masters of Rye, N.Y., in the spring of 2020. Masters is now preparing to graduate with a degree in economics from SUNY Binghamton.

"This scholarship has helped me explore everything Binghamton University has to offer," said Masters. "It has allowed me to widen my education outside of the classroom as well." Upon graduation, he will pursue a career in finance.

Masters caddied for five seasons at Bonnie Briar Country Club in Larchmont, N.Y., and conveys that his experience as a caddie shaped his ability to market himself in the professional world as he navigated through multiple internships and prepares for his future. "I think caddieing is such a great experience," said Masters. "It teaches you real life lessons and helps you position yourself for future success."

About the JMS: The Jay Mottola Scholarship is a significant financial grant awarded to an outstanding caddie or young person who works in service to golf in the Met Area. This need-based award is available to exceptional graduating high school seniors from Long Island, New Jersey, and Westchester who are eligible under their local Caddie Scholarship Fund's criteria. *The MGA Foundation is currently in the process of identifying the next candidate to receive the Jay Mottola Scholarship; the JMS Committee will announce the new recipient by spring of 2022.*

GROWING THE CADDIE YARD

During the 2021 season, the MGA Foundation conducted 10 virtual Caddie Academies for young men and women in the Met Area, certifying 250 new caddies. A cornerstone of the Foundation's programming, Caddie Academies provide participants with a basic understanding of how to get started as a caddie and make their first successful loop. The MGA Foundation offers a selection of on-site Advanced Caddie Trainings during the season. These "next step" sessions offer more in-depth, on-course topics and best practices to current caddies at Met Area clubs. 

The MGA Foundation was saddened to announce the passing of Paul R. Dillon on July 20. Dillon, a past president of the MGA, chair of the MGA Foundation, and recipient of the MGA's Distinguished Service Award, was a longtime advocate of the game as a leader, coach, and artist. He was one of the most recognizable figures in Met Area golf, and was dedicated to spreading the game's values and traditions.

Dillon first began volunteering with the MGA and the Westchester Golf Association in the early 1990s. He quickly began to take on leadership positions and served as President of the WGA from 1994-1995. He was President of the Westchester Golf Association Caddie Scholarship Fund from 1997-2001, and post-presidency remained an active Director on the WGACSF Board.

Dillon also rose through the ranks of volunteer leadership at the MGA, and was elected to two terms as President of the MGA and Chair of the MGA Foundation from 2003-2004. Dillon was instrumental in launching the MGA's Capital Campaign, on which he served as co-chairman with Lowell Schulman, and his efforts played a large part in expanding the MGA Foundation's GOLFWORKS program.

Sentiments summarized in the announcement of Dillon's Distinguished Service Award remained true until his passing: Paul's dedication to spreading the game's values and traditions along with his relentless service have made him one of the most beloved members of our golf community.

To form a lasting memorial, a Paul R. Dillon Endowed Scholarship within the Westchester Golf Association Caddie Scholarship Fund (WGACSF) is in the process of being established. To learn more, please visist caddiescholarship.org.
