GOLFWORKS: THE YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2022 season saw continued growth for the MGA Foundation's signature GOLFWORKS student intern program. Throughout the Met Area, 183 students interned at 44 clubs and facilities, learning new skills and gaining experience in the workplace. A total of 66 of these interns were first-year participants in the program and worked in golf shops, on outside operations teams, with food and beverage departments, and in administrative roles. The MGA Foundation welcomed seven new clubs to the program, including Sleepy Hollow and Hollywood that supported the Ukranian GOLFWORKS initiative.

In the spring of 2022, EIKOH HAYASHI of Bronxville, N.Y., was named the second recipient of the Jay Mottola Scholarship. Hayashi, a former caddie at Westchester Country Club, is studying Commercial Aviation at the University of North Dakota. This summer, he was accepted into a highly-competitive internship program with Delta Airlines, which included observing the airline's operations in Japan.

"I am extremely honored and grateful to be the Jay Mottola Scholarship recipient," said Hayashi. "This opportunity is life-changing, and this scholarship will quite literally help me fly into the sky as a Commercial Aviation major."

Hayashi immigrated to the United States in 2015 from Japan. In high school, he was nationally ranked in tennis before he took up golf during his junior year. He led his golf team to States during his senior year and continues to work on his game during his free time.
