

COURTESY REMINDER

Contestants are reminded that when a club graciously agrees to host an MGA Championship or USGA qualifying tournament, it inconveniences its members and incurs an expense in staffing the club facilities so that the tournament players may be properly serviced and extended full hospitality.

Due to the time pressures of the day and the need to give full attention to the competitive aspect of play, contestants may forget, as guests, their responsibilities to the host club. Courtesy suggests that players be mindful of the services the club has gone out of its way to provide.

SPECIFICALLY, CONTESTANTS ARE ASKED TO:

USE CLUB LOCKER ROOM FOR CHANGES OF CLOTHES AND SHOES. Players should leave an appropriate gratuity for attendant.

EAT LUNCH AT THE CLUB, WHETHER THIS BE IN THE RESTAURANT, GRILL, OR HALFWAY HOUSE.

Anticipating your needs, the club has prepared food and scheduled its staff for your pleasure and convenience.

SUPPORT THE GOLF SHOP AT THE CLUB. The facility has been staffed to provide conveniences for this day(s).

Your consideration would be greatly appreciated. The opportunity to play competitive golf at quality courses may not continue in years ahead, unless contestants recognize their responsibilities as guests to support the host club in the services it offers for your benefit.

LOCAL RULES AND TERMS OF COMPETITION FOR 2024 MGA CHAMPIONSHIPS



The Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and The R&A govern play. These Local Rules and Terms of the Competition are in effect at all MGA championships and qualifying rounds. See applicable championship or qualifying round Notice to Players and Entry Form for modifications or additions to these Local Rules and Terms of the Competition. Complete text of the Rules and Local Rules may be found in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf, effective January 2024.

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule or Term is:

LOCAL RULES

MODEL LOCAL RULES REFERRED TO BELOW ARE FOUND IN THE OFFICIAL GUIDE TO THE RULES OF GOLF, SECTION 8-COMMITTEE PROCEDURES

The Notice to Players will be provided at the starter's table and should be reviewed prior to the start of play. Players should not refer to host club scorecards for Local Rules as they may not be in effect.

CODE OF CONDUCT: the MGA's Code of Conduct for competitors, caddies and guests is in effect at all MGA administered championships and qualifiers, as described in the Code of Conduct on the starter's table.

OUT OF BOUNDS: Defined by the line between the course-side points, at ground level, of white stakes and fence posts. Where stone walls define Out of Bounds the wall is a Boundary Object. A ball is considered Out of Bounds when it comes to rest beyond the wall. A ball coming to rest on or beyond a road defined as Out of Bounds is Out of Bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the Course that is in bounds for other holes. Gates in boundary fences are Integral Objects.

PENALTY AREAS: When a Penalty Area is defined on only one side, it extends to infinity. When a Penalty Area is connected to the Out of Bounds edge, the Penalty Area extends to and coincides with Out of Bounds. Artificial walls and pilings when located in Penalty Areas and Bunkers are Integral Objects. No free relief is available.

RELIEF ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF RED PENALTY AREA: When the edge of a Red Penalty Area coincides with the boundary of the course, opposite side relief is available as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures. Model Local Rule B-2.1 is in effect, as amended by Model Local Rule B-2.2 and Clarification to Model Local Rule B-2.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR: Defined by white lines. French drains are Ground Under Repair. For grass-covered trenching, see Temporary Power Lines and Cables.

Ground Under Repair may include areas of unusual damage, including areas where spectators or other traffic has combined with wet conditions to affect materially the ground surface, but only when so declared by an authorized member of the Committee. When immediately adjacent to an Immovable Obstruction, such an area is part of that Obstruction.

RELIEF FROM SEAMS OF CUT TURF: Model Local Rule F-7as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

DECORATIVE FLOWER BEDS AND TURF NURSERIES are No Play Zones and treated as Ground Under Repair. Player must proceed under Rule 16.1.

BUNKER LINERS: An authorized member of the Committee may treat an exposed Bunker liner as Ground Under Repair, but interference does not exist if the liner only interferes with a player's Stance.

AERATION HOLES: Model Local Rule E-4 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

STAKES AND CABLES SUPPORTING TREES (but not the trees themselves) are Immovable Obstructions. Relief is available under Rule 16.1.

LANDSCAPED OR GARDEN AREAS COMPLETELY ENCIRCLED BY AN OBSTRUCTION are treated as a single Abnormal Course Condition.

WHITE LINES TIED INTO OBSTRUCTIONS: White-lined areas connected to an Obstruction are a single Abnormal Course Condition when taking relief under Rule 16.1.

WOOD CHIPS AND MULCH are Loose Impediments.

CABLES, RODS, WIRES AND WRAPPINGS when closely attached to trees are Integral Objects. No free relief is available.

BALL DEFLECTED BY OVERHEAD POWER LINE; Model Local Rule E-11 is in effect and modified as follows: if it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line in bounds, the stroke does not count. The player must play a ball without penalty from where the previous stroke was made (see Rule 14.6 for what to do).

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS CLOSE TO PUTTING GREENS (2x2): Model Local Rule F-5.2 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. This Local Rule only applies when both the ball and the obstruction are in part of the general area cut to fairway height or less.

TEMPORARY POWER LINES AND CABLES: Model Local Rule F-22 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS: Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule F-23. Either side relief, if provided, is described in the Notice to Players on the starter's table.

LIST OF CONFORMING DRIVER HEADS: Model Local Rule G-1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

LIST OF CONFORMING GOLF BALLS: Model Local Rule G-3 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

BROKEN OR SIGNIFICANTLY DAMAGED CLUB: Model Local Rule G-9 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

PACE OF PLAY: Players shall play without undue delay. See separate pace of play policy posted at the starter's table, if applicable.

STOPPING AND RESUMING PLAY: Model Local Rule J-1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

All practice areas are closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop practicing; failure to stop practicing might result in disqualification.

An immediate suspension will be signaled by one prolonged airhorn note, and players must immediately suspend play. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive airhorn notes. Resumption of play shall be signaled by two short airhorn notes.

PRACTICE: Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on the designated practice areas. Rule 5.2b is modified in this way: A player may not practice on the competition course before or between rounds. Penalty for breach of local rule, see Rule 5.2.

SPIKED GOLF SHOES: Model Local Rule G-7 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

CADDIE/CARTS: It is the policy of the MGA that caddies be assigned to players by the club caddie manager. Players may bring and use their own caddie only when specifically noted on the Notice to Players. There may be occasions when players are required to use a cart or a club caddie. Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule H-1.2, as modified by the Notice to Players on the starter's table.

USE OF MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION PROHIBITED: Model Local Rule G-6 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.. [This rule may be modified in certain MGA events. See Notice to Players on starter's table.]

MISSING PLAYER OR MARKER CERTIFICATION: Model Local Rule L-1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

SCORECARD COLLECTION : Immediately on completion of a round, the competitor shall return his or her card to the Committee. A scorecard is considered "returned" once the player has left the scorecard collection area with no intent to return to the area.

TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

WHEN COMPETITION IS FINAL: The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee. The result of a match is final when the Committee has approved the result as posted on the public scoreboard.

TIES AND PLAYOFFS: Contestants are reminded of their responsibility to keep informed regarding the possibility of playoffs due to ties. The method for resolving ties will be posted at the starter's table, if applicable.

CELLULAR PHONES: The use of any mobile or smart phone, when used for the purpose of communications, is prohibited on the course. Host course guidelines should be strictly followed with regard to use in locker rooms and parking lots.
