## TOP JUNIOR GOLFERS SET TO PLAY IN 96TH MET JUNIOR SPONSORED BY METLIFE

The final field is set for the 96th Met Junior Championship as 64 of the Met Area's finest junior golfers will take on Fairview Country Club in Greenwich, Conn. beginning on August 16. One of the strongest fields in recent history will compete for the nation's oldest junior championship.

The field includes 2012 runner-up Will Bernstein of New York, N.Y., who will look to take home the trophy for himself this year. Bernstein, 17, played in this year's Ike Cham-

pionship and recently qualified for the U.S. Junior Amateur, which will take place the week after the Met Junior.

Three of Bernstein's fellow competitors in the Met Junior qualified for the U.S. Junior as well, including 2011 Carter Cup champion Cameron Young, 15, of Scarborough, N.Y., who is recovering from a shoulder injury that occurred earlier this season. Young was a member of the victorious 2012 Williamson Cup and 2013 Carey Cup teams, Norwalk's Jacob Henny also qualified and just last week won the MGA/MetLife Public Links Championship by three strokes. A third talented member of a victorious Carey Cup team (2011) is Wake Forest bound Clancy Waugh of Quogue, N.Y. Accomplished Christian Brothers Academy player Jeremy Wall, 17, of Brielle, N.J., was a semifinalist at last year's Met Junior at Nissequoque Golf Club.

Wall's two CBA teammates will be joining him at Fairview, including his older brother, Lehigh University bound Ethan Wall and 2012 MGA/MetLife Boys runner-up Vincent Palazzolo, 16, of Colts Neck, N.J. The Wall brothers and Palazzolo helped lead their school to claim the state team title at the 2013 NJSIAA Tournament of Champions in May. Other past MGA champions in the field include two other past MGA/MetLife Boys Champions: Willis Huynh of Syosset, N.J. (2012) and Mark Reilly of Babylon, N.Y. (2009). Reilly advanced to the quarterfinals in this event last

year and finished as runner-up in the 2012 MGA/MetLife Public Links Championship at Bethpage Black. 2012 Carter Cup winner Jared Mac-tas of Woodcliffe Lake, N.J., is also competing.

The Met Junior Sponsored by MetLife has a long history of having a highly competitive field, and the championship records are scattered with big names in both national and regional golf circles. From a starting field of 64, the field gets narrowed down in 18-hole matches for the three day event. The field is composed of juniors who have not yet turned 19 and who have not yet started college. The championship is preceded by the MGA/MetLife Pro-Ju-nior, in which the contestants team with Met Area golf professionals in competition and also have the opportunity to get an up-close look at the venue.

Fairview Country Club, a Robert Trent Jones course, has been the host of the Met Open, Met Amateur, and the 2011 Ike Championship. This will be Fairview's first Met Junior and the contrasting nines will be sure to challenge the juniors.

## About Fairview Country Club



The Fairview Country Club traces its roots to 1904 and the Fairview Links in Bronxville, half a mile from the Harlem Railroad depot. The nine-hole course was built in the late 1890's, and among those playing there in 1900 were the founders of the Siwanoy Country Club.

The club lost its lease after the 1907 season, and had to move -- to the Decker farm in Elmsford, 95 acres of running streams, and very few trees. There they built a short 18-hole golf course, and converted a farmhouse into a clubhouse.

Within a few years that land was needed by New York City for an aqueduct, and so the club moved across the street to the Shrady estate, 500 yards away. The English Tudor Shrady mansion, with a great view across the Saw Mill River Valley, became the Fairview clubhouse. The new 18-hole golf course, designed by Donald Ross, opened in 1912.

That course served the club until 1968 when the move to the present site off King Street in Greenwich took place. Commercialization of the Elmsford area and the coming of Route 287 in 1960 shattered the tranquility of the club's old setting. The club engaged Robert Trent Jones to design an 18-hole course which was ready for play in 1968. With that final move the club has found what seems likely to be a permanent home.

Fairview's two nines present a marked contrast in styles. To score well, one must stay out of the water on the relatively short front nine -- water is very much in play on five of the first seven holes -- then parlay length and accuracy on the longer back nine. The course has been the host of the Met Open and Met Amateur.

# 95th Met Junior Championship

Scott Kim of River Edge, N.J., brought home his first career victory after surviving six rounds of match play to capture the title at the 95th Met Junior Championship sponsored by MetLife. The 64 talented teens competing in the 100th anniversary of the first Met Junior, held at Plainfield in 1912, prevailed through weather delays and held their own over the challenging and strategic layout at Nissequogue. The final match saw a battle between 18-year-old Kim and 16-year-old Will Bernstein, the 2012 LIGA Junior champion.

After starting the round 3 down through three holes, Kim fought back despite the occasional rain and windy conditions and started making pars and birdies to claw back into the match and overtake Bernstein, finishing the match with a 3 & 2 victory. The Met Junior is the oldest junior championship in the country, and winning the prestigious title is a great first win for Kim.

# History of the Met Junior Championship



The nation's oldest junior championship was founded in 1912 by Leighton Calkins, a former member of the MGA and USGA Executive Committees. Over the ensuing years, the Met Junior has produced a number of winners who have gone on to outstanding achievements on both the regional and national levels.

Frank Strafaci, who won the Met Junior at Apawamis in 1935, later became the only seven-time champion of the Met Amateur. In 1961, Claude Harmon Jr., better known today as Butch, captured the title at Inwood. Seven years later, his younger brother Bill won the Junior at Morris County Golf Club. Both brothers followed in their legendary father's footsteps and became internationally recognized golf instructors. Other well-known Met Area instructors who are former Met Junior champions include Tom Patri Jr. (1976) and Mike Lopuszynski (1982).

More recently, 1994 Junior champion Marc Turnesa won a tournament in his rookie season on the PGA Tour in 2008, and 1997 Junior champion Andrew Svoboda, who captured the 2003 Met Open while still an amateur, plays on the Nationwide Tour. In 2003, Mike Quagliano, of GlenArbor, came within a whisker of winning the Met Amateur two weeks after winning the Junior, losing in the finals on the 37th hole. In 2009, David Pastore captured his second Met Junior title, a feat that only few have accomplished in the event's storied history.

The Junior champion is awarded the esteemed Mandeville Trophy, and it is one of the toughest MGA trophies to win. Sectional qualifying throughout the Met Area narrows a typical entrant pool of 300 junior golfers down to 64, who are then seeded in a match play bracket. The winner must survive a grueling schedule that includes six matches over three days.

The championship is preceded by the MGA/MetLife Pro-Junior, in which the contestants team with Met Area golf professionals in a competition and also have the opportunity to get an up-close look at the venue for the Junior championship. Players and their families are then guests at the traditional Junior Banquet on the eve of the championship.
